Another day we'll need volunteers is Clubs' Day, 28 April, from 12 to 4. Tables will be set aside for representatives from the local clubs to sit and build and meet the public. Tom is working with some local papers to get free publicity. A great chance to do some recruiting!

Tom also wanted to mention that there are two Open Builds. Everyone is welcome to bring their stuff and sit and build and yak. Sat Apr 14 and 21 noon to 4 PM.

Of course, club members are welcome to participate in the In-the-Case Contest. Registration for that runs from April 1 to April 15. No entry fee for Juniors or Recreational modelers. Hard Core, that's the division judged with elimination style methods, has a \$5 entry fee per model. Cash prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd.

Meeting Minutes for March 7, 2007

Al called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. with 25 members and guests present. 2 arrived afterward.

Correspondence:

Cliff Davis reported that Tom Grossman sent him a notice about working with Bonnie Brae Hobby Shop to put on a future contest. Tom wants to know if we can count on support from our club. Cliff also told us that a new IPMS chapter has been formed in Region 10. The Zia club is located near Albuquerque, NM.

Treasury:

Dallas Lloyd reported that there is currently \$3,714.19 in the account.

Old Business:

Al Gonzalez brought up the discussion on whether we should try and get the Nationals to come here in 2009. Mark Persichetti said we should try our hand at a Regional before we commit to a Nationals. Al suggested a 5 person exploratory committee be formed to see if hosting a Regional or Nationals is feasible. It was decided by the membership not to try for the 2009 Nationals. The exploratory committee will consist of Al Gonzalez, Loren Hansen, Jennifer Jordan, David Reinecke, Mark Persichetti, and possibly Martin Sagara.

Al then brought up the subject of the contest next month and what to do about the suggestion of having a separate judging for the CONG models. Mark Persichetti said that anyone who has built a CONG model, regardless of when or if it will be in the display, should be in that separate contest. Chuck Stout told us that he believed that only the people who are specifically building for the display be allowed to in the separate contest. Al really wants us to impress the general. Martin Sagara, who came up with the idea, saw the separate contest as an opportunity to recognize the volunteers, as happens at the Wings Over the Rockies museum. He, Jennifer Jordan, and Loren Hansen want the contest to only have the display models. The motion was made, seconded, and voted upon. The separate contest will be only for the models being specifically made for the display.

Don Smith mentioned that he is looking for anyone to volunteer to hold a decal clinic for his club, Denver Narrow Gauge Circle. No one stepped up to volunteer.

No previous contest winners (1st, 2nd or 3rd) from ANY local, regional or national contest may be entered. Previous winners may be displayed only.

There will be NO separate out of the box class.

There will be NO SWEEPS: that is, no one individual may win 1st, 2nd or 3rd in a single class. One may win 1st in aircraft, second in armor and 1st in vignettes, but not 1st and 2nd in aircraft, armor or vignettes.

There is a provision for 'splits' within categories Example: if 12 of 20 entries in a/c are ME-109s then we could place all 109s in a single category for judging and judge the other 8 entries separately

As president of the IPMS Denver/Rob Wolf Chapter, it is my honor to submit the chapter as Chapter of the Year. 2006 was a great year for the chapter, with a mix of special programs, great guest speakers, and service to the local community.

Of course, it's all about the members. We total over 30 active members, including a great mix of skills and modeling interests. In the group, you'll find all model categories represented. We have our wing nuts, tread heads, car kooks, ship shemps, and figure fanciers. Our modeling skills run the gamut from several Nationals winners to the humble beginner - and a whole bunch of folks who just collect kits but never build a thing! We're proud to also have two active female members. No matter what gender, special interest, or skill level, they all share one thing in common - an uncommon spirit of volunteerism. Whether it's assisting the club with a program, sharing a skill with a new modeler, or helping out the community, it's a mile-high-can-do attitude!

The volunteer spirit is alive and well in several of our club members. At the risk of leaving some out, I'd like to highlight three individuals. David Reinecke writes our monthly newsletter, and has been recognized

for his work. His handiwork received "Newsletter of the Year" for Region 10. Jennifer Jordan coordinates many of our programs with Wings Over the Rockies museums, and is the club's audiovisual specialist. Vice President Martin Sagara keeps us entertained and informed with his seemingly endless supply of guest speakers. Thanks to Martin, we actually have a backlog of guest speakers! Of course, I could write similar paragraphs about the majority of the club membership.

Our programs vary from you typical modeling skill seminars to an awesome variety of guest speakers. Our usual skill seminar was something like our "tool time" program. That month, members brought and demonstrated their most unusual modeling tool. Other annual favorites are our post-Nationals review, an hour-long slide presentation by those that attended the convention; the in-house club contest; our fund-raising kit auction; and topping off the year, the "Cut-Throat Gift Exchange".

Our active guest speaker program is always a highlight. It has featured such dynamic individuals as Mr. Earl Clark, one of the original members of the 10th Mountain Division. He told us how the unit was formed here in Colorado, and about their exploits in Alaska and Italy. His account of the battle of Riva Ridge left us all awed at the courage of these brave men. Another highlight was a presentation from Mr. Bruce Borman, former B-17 crew-member. Mr. Borman entertained and thrilled us with his retelling of combat missions for the 12th and 15 th Air Forces over North Africa, Italy, and Germany. All of our guest speakers are awarded an honorarium model, built by a club member.

Service to the community is what we take the most pride in. We support our local hobby shops, area clubs, museums, and youth organizations. On a cool and rainy August, we supported our local hobby shop during their annual outdoor tent sale. We set up a demonstration table, and talked to interested passers-by about our club and our hobby. In October, we supported our neighboring Fort Collins High Plains Modelers annual mall contest. Wing Over the Rockies (WOTR) is our "adopted" museum, where several club members volunteer their time. In 2006, we supported two WOTR events. Many of our club members spent a terrific day supporting their Aeromodeling Expo in January. We also supported a museum fund-raising event in honor of Chuck Yeager. Club members built several of General Yeager's aircraft for a well-received exhibit. Last but not least, the club donated annual memberships to a local Junior ROTC chapter.

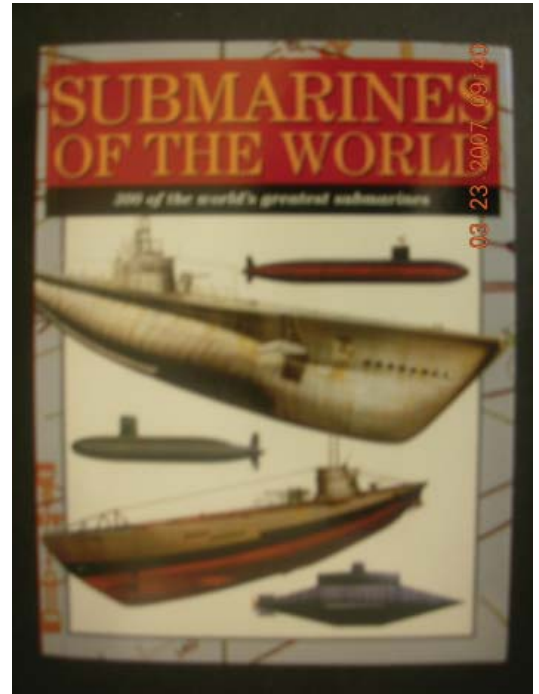
Submarines of the World

Robert Jackson

This Barnes and Noble Special was really a bargain, marked down to only \$5.98 plus tax. Though I have several books on underwater craft such as : Submarines of WW II by Bagnasco, The Submarine Book by R.Compton-Hall and The U-Boat by Rössler; this one seems to hit a lot of different types in a less technical manner than the above texts. Jackson gives the reader an alphabetical listing of over 280 important or influential submersibles from the Fulton Nautilus of 1797 through today's huge nuclear powered craft.

Each has a color side-view artwork and is accompanied by details in the form of an easily read specification table listing : country, launch date, crew, armament, power plant, range and performance plus information that summarizes the career of the craft.



Jackson's introduction to the book is in the form of a simple concise history of the submarine, beginning with the first concept by two French priests, Fathers Mersenne and Fornier in 1634 and continuing to contemporary times. I did not realise previously that there were quite a few diesel - electric subs of modern design still in front line service by nations who currently lack nuclear capable equipment.

Jackson concludes with 23 pages on underwater weapons which include torpedos and submarine launched missiles which are also illustrated in color.

Overall, it's a small, quickly accessible manual for fast reference, although no instruction or mention is given on the use of permanent markers for submarine replicas.

**How to spend \$1000 in Colpar's parking lot.
